Music

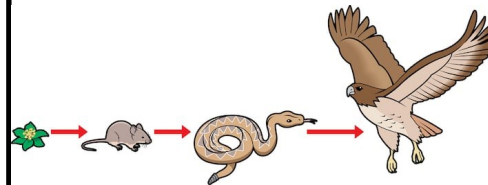
The children will continue to develop their Tenor horn skills under the watchful eye of Mr Lavelle.

Geography/History

Our topic, this term, is 'Geographical Skills and Field-work'. The children will be looking at land use in our local area, and recording their findings through sketches, tables and charts. We will be learning the skills required to read maps and complete orienteering challenges.



Maple—Summer 2019

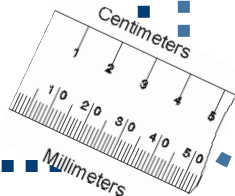


Science

This term, Maple Class will be looking at food chains and habitats. We will be learning how to gather information on the number and variety of different living things, and investigate how the balance of wildlife can change if a food source disappears. We will also learn about electricity.

Spanish

We will continue to develop our spoken Spanish and learn about time and sports.



Maths

This term, children will consolidate their knowledge of the number system, working with numbers up to 4 digits and to two decimal places. We will be using our reasoning strategies to help us solve multi-step problems and open ended investigations. Children will be asked to 'prove it' using diagrams and manipulatives to secure their understanding.

Learning times tables up to 12x12 and developing fluency strategies for mental arithmetic will continue to be a focus this term.

RE/PHSE and Citizenship

Our PHSE and Citizenship topic is about respecting differences and changes. In RE, we will be exploring the beliefs of Sikhism and Christianity.
