Curriculum information and homework expectations

Next week, parents/carers will receive via schoolcomms the details of the curriculum for their child's class for the Spring Term. With this information, will be the expectations that the teachers have with regards to homework. The extra learning children do at home is a valuable supplement to a child's development. There will be deadlines set that children must meet. Please help your children to meet these, regularly.

Cognitive learning and retrieval practice

In our assemblies this term, Mr Cano will be exploring ideas of cognitive learning with our pupils and the difference between 'Growth' and 'Closed' mindsets. Cognitive learning is a type of learning that is active, constructive, and long-lasting. It also engages pupils in the learning processes, teaching them to use their brains more effectively to make connections while learning. This links closely to a highly informative staff Inset session last term on retrieval practice, that was led by Dr Gareth Bates, our Chair of Governors, and an expert in cognitive theory. During each assembly, we will add new information about how our brains work and how we can help them to remember what we have learned. Why not speak with your children about learning and why it is important to adopt an 'I can do it' attitude?

Feel Good Week (5th- 9th February 2023)

Feeling Good Week is a Hertfordshire-wide event that encourages schools and the wider community to promote children and young people's emotional wellbeing by raising awareness of mental health and showing where support can be accessed within the community.

During this week, we want to help make our children feel good by running our own special activities in school to boost their emotional and mental wellbeing. A message from the SENCO on fidget-tools in school

As you may be aware, all staff are committed to recognising the individual needs of all our pupils. We know that some children have sensory needs which may require them to have fidget tools within the classroom. These should only be provided after conversations between parents/ carers and school staff have taken place. We have noticed that many children are bringing fidgets into the classrooms without these discussions taking place. In this instance, they can quickly become a distraction and a source of disagreements between children. Moving forward, we would ask that if you believe your child needs a fidget tool, you discuss this with your child's class teacher. If an agreement is reached that your child may benefit from a fidget tool to aid their learning, school will provide a fidget to be used and kept within school. We would ask for your support in streamlining the number of fidgets in school as well as the style of fidgets in use.

Warm welcomes to the staff team

This term, we welcome back a familiar face, as well as two entirely new members of the staff team. Mrs Barhey has returned to Year 3, whilst Mrs Nicol (a new mother of baby Flora) is away on maternity leave. We also welcome Miss Radford to the EYFS team, who will be replacing Miss Cunnigham who left last term. Finally, we welcome Mrs Pike, who will be working as an additional Learning Support Assistant for some of our children with additional needs.

Clubs for the Spring Term

In addition to our lunchtime football, gymnastics and Hama beads clubs, the afterschool clubs running for the first half of the Spring term are cheerleading (Mondays), netball (Wednesdays) and Glee (Thursdays). We hope you appreciate that the decision to close is never made lightly, as the safety and welfare of our children, school staff and parents/carers is of paramount importance, and no one would like to see this compromised.
