# Change to Inset day

It has become necessary for us to move the date of the Inset day, for this term, from Friday 11<sup>th</sup> March to Friday 28<sup>th</sup> January. The reason for this move is to allow time for the school staff to be trained on a new phonics and early reading scheme. Following the Ofsted Inspection in September, it has become crucial for the school to change the way we teach phonics and to find a new and approved scheme. We expect the new approaches will result in pupils making more rapid progress in their learning of phonics and, in turn, to becoming better readers, earlier. It will also give us more consistency to the teaching of phonics and early reading across the school. We apologise for any inconvenience that this change in date poses for you.

# Cognitive learning

In our assemblies this term, Mr Cano will be exploring ideas of cognitive learning with our pupils and the difference between 'Growth' and 'Closed' mindsets. Cognitive learning is a type of learning that is active, constructive, and long-lasting. It also engages pupils in the learning processes, teaching them to use their brains more effectively to make connections while learning. This links closely to a highly informative staff Inset session at the end of last term that was led by Dr Gareth Bates, one of our school governors and a parent, on cognitive theory. During each assembly, we will add a new part to the learning Superhero we will be building! Why not speak with your children about learning and why it is important to adopt an 'I can do it' attitude?

As part of the school's planning for emergencies, parents are reminded that incidents that necessitate school closure include such things as extreme weather and loss of essential electrical, water or heating services. Details of school closures will be texted to parents via Schoolcomms. They will also be displayed on the front page of the school website and on Twitter. On days when the weather conditions are poor, but the school is open, parents are advised to walk to school, if possible, and, for those driving, it is advisable to park on Purwell Lane or Kingswood Avenue and walk the remainder. We hope you appreciate that the decision to close is never made lightly, as the safety and welfare of our children, school staff and parents/carers is of paramount importance, and no one would like to see this compromised.

#### STEM - Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths

As you will have seen on Twitter this week, we are encouraging the children across the school to be STEM Explorers as a cross curricular approach to science this half term. STEM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths. Through this unit the children will be presented with a series of challenges which they must work together on to design, produce, and then test within a time frame. Collaborative learning is an essential part of the unit to share and develop the skills they have within their teams.

For the unit to be successful, we need your help. Please can you collect these items from home over the next 3 weeks, so the children have a wide range of resources to use within the challenges?

Items needed are listed below. If there are other items you think would be practical to build with that are not listed below, please ask your child's class teacher.

Cardboard tubes - long and short. Smaller cardboard boxes such as cereal boxes/shoe boxes/tissue boxes etc. Larger cardboard boxes can be sent in, but they need to be cut down into smaller pieces first please to reduce the space they take up. Bottle tops from milk cartons, water bottles, fruit shoot bottles etc. Caps from de-icer tins, polish etc. Small plastic trays / tubs / yoghurt pots from food items (please clean before sending in). Bubble wrap, packaging noodles. Netting from fruit. Corks. Toothpicks / Cotton buds - obviously unused! Elastic bands. Small plastic bottles, such as Fruit Shoot sized (uncrushed) but not large plastic bottles and no detergent containers please. String/ribbon/Wool. Spare rolls of tape. Foil / Cling film (not used). Cotton Wool / Cotton Wool Balls. Paper cups. Straws.

Please bear in mind that if all children were to bring several bags of recyclable rubbish to school, we will be unable to store it in the classrooms, so we are just asking for a small contribution of items per household each week to replenish the stock as they use it. Class teachers will let the children know if they need to collect more or less of any item for an upcoming challenge.
