Problems Applying for Reception places

School closures - Winter 2025

As part of the school's planning for emergencies, parents are reminded that incidents that necessitate school closure include such things as extreme weather and loss of essential electrical, water or heating services. Details of school closures will be texted to parents via Schoolcomms. They will also be displayed on the front page of the school website and on Twitter. On days when the weather conditions are poor, but the school is open, parents are advised to walk to school, if possible, and, for those driving, it is advisable to park on Purwell Lane or Kingswood Avenue and walk the remainder. We hope you appreciate that the decision to close is never made lightly, as the safety and welfare of our children, school staff and parents/carers is of paramount importance, and no one would like to see this compromised.

Taking holidays during term time

We kindly remind parents to avoid taking their children on holiday during term time. Such absences disrupt your child's learning and can impact the overall school environment. The government has recently introduced a new national framework for penalty notices regarding unauthorised term-time holidays. These measures are now in effect. For further details, please refer to the information provided below. To assist with your planning, the term dates for the next academic year are listed below. We encourage all families to check these dates before booking any holidays. Thank you for your support in prioritising your child's education.

The New National Framework for Penalty Notices

From 19 August 2024, a new national framework for Penalty Notices regarding school attendance has been introduced across all schools in England. This ensures consistency in addressing unauthorised absences.

Threshold for Penalty Notices:

A Penalty Notice must be considered for any child with 10 sessions (equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10-school-week period. These absences do not need to be consecutive and can include any combination of unauthorised absences. For example, a single 5-day unauthorised leave of absence would meet this threshold. The 10-week period may span different terms or school years.

Penalty Notice Fines:

First Offence:

£80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

£160 per parent, per child if paid between 22 and 28 days.

Second Offence (within 3 years):

£160 per parent, per child with no reduced rate. Payment must be made within 28 days.

Third and Further Offences (within 3 years):

No Penalty Notice will be issued. Cases will be taken directly to the Magistrates' Court, where fines can reach up to £2,500, and criminal records may result.

This framework reinforces the importance of consistent school attendance. Please ensure absences are authorised by the school to avoid fines. If you have any questions or require further clarification, feel free to contact us.
