## New School dinners system

We are excited to announce the launch of our new online school lunch ordering system. The current system we use is very antiquated, and time consuming. This user-friendly platform allows you to conveniently order your child's lunch from the comfort of your home before they come to school. You will be able to select from a variety of nutritious and delicious meal options for your child as provided by Herts Catering and it offers a hassle-free way to order food and will free up valuable teaching time in the classroom.

The new system is an electronic ordering system using the school gateway, where you can order food up to 3 weeks in advance for your children. To be able to pre-order a school meal you will need to have sufficient funds in the child's account.

A letter will be sent out this week outlining what parents have to do to enable the system to be up to date with information before the start date. This new system will start on the  $16^{th}$  April 2024 for the summer term. We believe that this new online ordering system will streamline the lunch process and provide a convenient solution for busy parents.

### Sports update

It has been a busy term for our school teams, with netball, football and cricket fixtures against other schools and an athletics competition held at Fearnhill.

Our team of 30 athletes performed admirably at the Sports Hall competition, a mixture of indoor running, throwing, and jumping events. Finishing in 3<sup>rd</sup> place was a tremendous achievement although, with only the top 2 schools qualifying, we narrowly missed out on progressing to the next round.

After some heavy defeats earlier in the season, this half term has seen our netball teams put in some very impressive performances, attacking with great speed of handling and movement. Due to the prolonged period of heavy rain having caused postponements to fixtures, we recently played three matches on consecutive days and although our A and B teams lost to Whitehill on the Wednesday, we were delighted to record victories over Weston and William Ransom in our Monday and Tuesday matches. During matches, players rotate their positions between each of the 4 quarters and it has been wonderful to see everyone becoming more comfortable and confident when playing in each of the 7 positions. Well done to everyone who has represented the school so far and we are looking forward to the A Team, B Team and Boys' rallies at the start of the Summer Term.

Our footballers have been in a rich vein of form and concluded their League fixtures with a win over Oughton. The team have gone unbeaten since this term and have been showing great skill, passion and determination in their matches. In their first matches for the school, a team from Years 3 and 4 played very well in fixtures against Ickleford and St.Andrews. Mr Sears was especially pleased with how well they put into action all the skills that they have been practising in their lunchtime club. The school football season concludes this week with a B Team rally on Thursday afternoon and an A Team rally at Wilshere-Dacre on Saturday. Good luck to all involved.

In readiness for the cricket season that gets underway in the Summer Term, we also have a cricket friendly match against Whitehill this Thursday. During lunchtime sessions, the players have been practising their bowling, fielding and batting and the progress has been impressive- particularly in developing fluid bowling actions. We're really looking forward to seeing our cricket team in action for the first time.
