### Christmas Lunch - Wednesday 13th December

It will be assumed that all pupils will have the Christmas lunch, unless you inform us otherwise. Please advise the school office, as soon as possible, if you would like your child to have the vegetarian option or a home packed lunch.

If your child does not normally eat school lunches, but you would like them to have Christmas lunch please let us know by 29<sup>th</sup> November. However, if they have an allergy or intolerance to any foods, please complete an online form, giving details of the allergy or intolerance, to ascertain whether a modified meal can be provided for them. ### Dealing with bullying update

At Purwell, we respond immediately if bullying is suspected. We work with children, their parents and staff, to resolve ongoing incidents of regular unkindness. Occasionally, the graduated approach to consequences, as detailed in our behaviour policy, [Purwell Primary School » Policies](#) is not enough to stop the unkind behaviour from being repeated and more serious consequences are required. This week, we were compelled to issue a fixed term exclusion for a pupil in the upper juniors, for their ongoing unkindness toward another child in their class. The situation met all three criteria for bullying, Being unkind, On purpose, Over and over -BOO for short. The parents of the children involved have been informed and are kept updated.

### PE kit

As the weather is now turning a bit chillier, it is important that pupils have the proper outdoor PE kit in addition to their indoor kit, for outdoor lessons. This is a navy, Purwell PE sweatshirt (available from Beats, in Hitchin) and navy jogging bottoms.

### **Reading at home**

Please ensure that you hear your child read regularly at home and that this is recorded in their reading record books. The record books are the only indication that your child is having regular opportunities to read to an adult. Comments in the books that relate to the child's phonological progress and comprehension are the most useful for teachers to read.
