### Sports Day - Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> June

This year, Sports Day will be on Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> June. The organisation of the day will be like previous years, with children taking part in a range of athletic events such as long jump, javelin, and discus, in addition to running races on the track. In the morning, from 9:30am, it will be the turn of Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 children: Acorn, Holly, and Willow Classes, with Key Stage 2 children: Beech, Maple, Aspen and Oak competing in the afternoon, from 1:30pm.

Teachers will be making sure that children have the opportunity to practice each of the events as part of their PE lessons this term. All children should make sure they have their PE kit (including proper trainers) in school so that they can take part. Parents are most welcome to watch their children on Sports Day - come and join us!

### Open Day/Evening - Wednesday 12th July
