## Meals for the Summer Term

The new menu for the Summer Term is attached and can be found on the school website.

From the  $1^{st}$  April 2023 the cost of a school meal has increased due to inflation to £3.15 per day. Dinners for children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 classes can have a school dinner at no charge under the government UIFSM (Universal Infant Free School Meal) scheme. If you feel you may qualify for income related free school meals for any year group it is easy to apply on-line at www.hertsdirect.org/freeschoolmeals or by phone on 0300-123-4048 and this may also provide additional benefit within school.

If you pay for school dinners you must have credit on your account to cover the cost of meals ordered, as the school has a zero debit policy.

## High energy drinks

We kindly ask parents not to provide their children with any high-energy drink bottles for school. We have noticed an increasing number of the older pupils bringing in 'trendy', PRIME drinks bottles into school. Although, on closer examination, these bottles are containing water, we believe that the promotion of these high-energy drinks is not appropriate for children of primary age.

## Sports update

It has been a busy term for our school teams, with netball and football fixtures against other schools and a Sports Hall Athletics competition held at Fearnhill.

Our team of 20 athletes performed admirably at the Sports Hall competition, a mixture of indoor running, throwing, and jumping events. Field events proved a real strength, with first place finishes in javelin and speed bounce and our 2-person relay teams also secured some points. Although we finished outside the top 2 schools - and so did not qualify for the next round - our athletes had lots of fun and did Purwell proud.

Our netball teams have put in some impressive performances, attacking with great speed of handling and movement. We have had a mixture of wins and losses, amongst which there have been many highlights - most notably Meghan's first quarter Hattrick against Samuel Lucas in a particularly exciting fixture. During matches, players rotate their positions between each of the 4 quarters and it has been wonderful to see everyone becoming more comfortable and confident when playing in each of the 7 positions. Well done to everyone who represented the school.

Our A Team footballer have had a remarkable season, going unbeaten throughout the league, and topping the Eastern-Hitchin Division. They will be in the play offs with the winners of the Western-Hitchin Division, early next term, to determine who will be crowned as League Champions. A terrific achievement!

Whilst the Girls' End of Season football rally was able to take place last weekend, unfortunately the weather caused some other netball and football rallies to be postponed. Hopefully, these will be able to be rearranged for next term. Despite kicking off in sunshine, the heavens opened as the Girls' football rally progressed. Even with increasingly wet conditions, our girls played enthusiastically, did some brilliant runs forward and had lots of fun. Having played in goal for the last two matches, if there was a competition for the muddiest Purwell kit ever seen, Evie was quite literally covered from head-to-toe and would have won hands down!

Congratulations to everybody who represented the school this term and we look forward to a full programme of Summer Term sport after Easter - watch this space!
