Since our last update, I am pleased to say that we have had no incidents of bullying behaviour reported in school.

Governors in action

At our recent Governing Body meeting, the governors discussed key updates on school growth, attendance, staffing, and site improvements.

With 163 pupils now on roll, our school continues to grow. Attendance has improved to 94.3%, exceeding the county threshold, and we aim to build on this progress. New staff members have joined, and a heating system upgrade has been approved for summer installation. Plans are also in place to enhance outdoor play areas.

Thanks to careful budget management, the school is ending the financial year in surplus. Parents are encouraged to participate in Ofsted's latest consultation on how it inspects school, for more information use this link <u>Improving the way Ofsted inspects education - GOV.UK</u> and news was shared that the PSA has provided £50 per teacher for classroom resources.

<u>Attendance update</u>

As part of our regular feature on attendance, I am pleased to announce that the current attendance for the school stands at 94.3%, which means we are still on track to achieve are 94% target this year. This looks even better in comparison to where we were at this time last year, when attendance stood at 93.2. So, we are 1.1% better so far this year than last year. Well done everyone! Let's keep coming to school every day.

Sports Report

Despite the weather, last half term was a really busy one for our school sports teams. We played football and netball matches against other schools and took part in Sports Hall Athletics and Rapid Fire cricket competitions.

There's a phrase in football that it's 'a game of two halves' and that's certainly been the case for Team Purwell as, in both of our last two A team matches, we found ourselves 2-0 down at half time. The second halves were totally different stories however as we showed great determination and resilience to bounce back to a narrow 2-1 defeat at Highover and a 3-3 draw with Ickleford.

After putting in a creditable performance against a very strong Whitehill team in their last match, our netballers were disappointed to have Wednesday's fixture against Highover called off due to the weather. With the end of season rallies approaching, it has been fantastic to see so many players coming to our netball club and to be able to be given the chance to represent the school.

Rapid Fire cricket is an indoor version of cricket and, towards the end of last half term, we took 2 teams of pupils from Years 3 and 4 to compete in a small schools competition over at Fearnhill School. Both teams performed brilliantly, with one team finishing as runners-up and the other team finishing 6th out of the 8 participating teams. The players were very nervous to start off with but grew in confidence and showed great teamwork and togetherness in the series of short matches that each team played.

We're looking forward to participating in the Hitchin School's cricket league this summer with our Y5/6 team and are hoping to organise some friendlies to bring along our Y4 children.

Despite being a small school, our athletes performed tremendously in their Sports Hall Athletics heat. Taking part in a mixture of field and track events, our team won the very first race (the Boys' Obstacle Race) and also the very last race (the Girls' 4x 1 lap Relay) to 'bookend' the competition wonderfully. Although results from individual events weren't published, there were many notable achievements in the field events too, with our pupils scoring highly across the jumping and throwing events.

Well done to all who took part in these events and a massive thank you to all the parents who have come along to support and helped with transportation.

We're now just waiting for the field to dry out enough for lunchtime cricket clubs to resume so that our players can get themselves ready for the coming season. With a trip to Lord's in the diary, our family day at Merchant Taylor's and our league fixtures to fulfil, it will be a fabulous summer.
