Change of Date - Sports Day, now Monday 14th July

Our planned Sports Day, originally scheduled for Thursday 26th June has a new date. Due to a clash in fixtures, our cricket team has reached the County Finals, which will take place on the same day, we have made the decision to reschedule Sports Day to Monday 14th July.

This change will allow our talented cricketers to both represent the school in the finals and participate fully in Sports Day, an important and enjoyable event in our school calendar. We trust that providing advance notice of the new date will help minimise any inconvenience for families.

Arrangements for Sports Day

The organisation of the day will be similar to previous years, with children taking part in a range of athletic events such as long jump, javelin and discus, in addition to running races on the track. In the morning, from 9:30am, it will be the turn of Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 children: Acorn N, Acorn R, Holly and Willow classes, with Key Stage 2 children: Beech, Maple, Aspen and Oak competing in the afternoon, from 1:30pm.

Teachers will be making sure that children have the opportunity to practice each of the events as part of their PE lessons this term. All children should make sure they have their PE kit (including proper trainers) in school so that they can take part.

Parents are most welcome to watch their children on Sports Day - come and join us!

Inter-House competitions

This term's inter-house competitions have already started and the children have been very excited to start earning points for their teams, with our winning team destined to be crowned at our Sports Day.

In addition to the points won on Sports Day, points are being earned in chess and table tennis competitions that are already underway with the basketball competition starting next week.

Open Day/Evening - Wednesday 9th July
