Music and Literacy, a New Learning Adventure

We are excited to share that this term our school has been selected to take part in the Literacy and Music Advocacy Project. Hertfordshire Music Service have chosen us as one of just four schools to join this global research project, which explores how music can support language and literacy development, drawing on international research led by Dr Anita Collins and her work on brain development.

Our Reception children will take part in short daily music activities, including singing, rhythm and movement. These sessions are designed to support focus, memory, emotional regulation and participation, while building the strong foundations children need for confident reading, writing and lifelong learning.

As we begin this exciting journey, we look forward to seeing how the project develops over the coming year and the positive impact it will have on our children's learning and development.

Curriculum information and homework expectations

Monday 19th January, each family will have received details of the curriculum for the Spring Term.

The homework teachers set is extra learning for children to do at home and it is a valuable supplement to a child's development. There will be deadlines set that children must meet. Please help your children to meet these, regularly.

Our School Values and Independent Learning Focus

At the start of this new term and new year, our assemblies are focusing on our school values. These are the values chosen by the children two years ago and they continue to guide how we learn, behave, and treat one another at Purwell.

We are reminding pupils of the importance of **Friendship, Honesty, Opportunity, Perseverance, and Equity**, and exploring what these look like in everyday school life. Assemblies have helped children think about what it means to be a positive member of a class, a team, and the clubs and groups they belong to both inside and outside of school. We have discussed how every group has its own principles and expectations, and how learning to respect these is an important life skill.

We have also linked our school values to the wider British values we promote, including **respect, fairness, responsibility, and understanding different viewpoints**, helping children see how their daily choices connect to the wider world.

Alongside this, we are placing a strong emphasis on independent working in class, linked to *The Purwell Way*. New posters are going up around the school, see below, encouraging children to be resourceful, to think for themselves, and to make the most of their learning time. This supports children in developing confidence, resilience, and independence as learners.

THINKS for Independence

Task- What do I need to do?

Help myself- Working wall, resources, examples

Independent try- Have a go first

Neighbour- Ask a friend

Keep trying- Try again, change strategy

Speak to an adult- Explain what I tried and where I am stuck.

Legislation update for parents taking holidays during the school term

Since last year, should parents remove their children for a holiday on a second occasion, the fine will be increased to £160, per child. Legislation now supports on the third transgression, parents would receive a summons to appear at judicial court. This is part of a government initiative to ensure that all children come to school every day, if they are able.

Attendance update

As part of our regular feature on attendance, I am pleased to announce that the current attendance for the school stands at 93.6%, which means we are slightly off-track to achieve our 94% target this year. So, let's keep coming to school every day!

School closures - Winter 2026

As part of the school's planning for emergencies, parents are reminded that incidents that necessitate school closure include such things as extreme weather and loss of essential electrical,

water or heating services. Details of school closures will be texted to parents via Schoolcomms. They will also be displayed on the front page of the school website and on Facebook. On days when the weather conditions are poor, but the school is open, parents are advised to walk to school, if possible, and, for those driving, it is advisable to park on Purwell Lane or Kingswood Avenue and walk the remainder. We hope you appreciate that the decision to close is never made lightly, as the safety and welfare of our children, school staff and parents/carers is of paramount importance, and no one would like to see this compromised.

Communicating with teachers

If you wish to contact your child's teacher for any reason, please do so via the school office by email, Absence-Misc@purwell.herts.sch.uk or by phoning 01462 432950. Alternatively, if you are able to, you can speak directly with the teacher at the start and the end of each day, before they enter the classroom to start the day, bearing in mind the limited time they have, but it might be long enough to deliver a message, or to arrange a meeting, if necessary. We can now also arrange video meetings on line for parents.

In most instances this has resulted in apologies being offered and received. In some cases, pupils have reported to adults, instances of unkindness and staff have responded quickly to nip matters in-the-bud, before they happen again.

Coats and Cold Weather Reminder

As the weather continues to be changeable, please make sure your child comes to school with a warm coat with a hood each day. We go outside whenever possible, even in light rain, so it's important they're properly dressed for the conditions.

Please ensure that all coats and other items that your child brings in to school are clearly labelled with their name, so that any lost belongings can be quickly returned. Thank you for your help in keeping everyone warm, dry and organised this season!
